Peter and Sue Ellen have been active members and volunteers within the Seneca Falls community for thirty years. Over those years, they have shared their time and talents with organizations like the First Presbyterian Church, the Johnson Home, Rotary, the ARC, the American Red Cross, and more. Peter served as the pastor of the First Presbyterian Church of Seneca Falls for twenty-five years, the longest pastorate on record for the church, while Sue Ellen served as an Elder in the church. Sue Ellen is currently a member of the Seneca County Children’s Committee and a Hospice volunteer. Recently, Peter and Sue Ellen spearheaded the dedication of the Alice Stokes Paul Pulpit at the First Presbyterian Church (October 2011). Suffragist and women’s rights leader Alice Stokes Paul first proposed the Equal Rights Amendment at the church in 1923.
